285	<p>Public Open Forum:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cllr Tripp spoke on taking back ownership of Lake Windermere in the process of the Local Government Reorganisation. The funds to purchase the lake bed was given to the local people for the benefit of the local area and should remain that way. A sum of circa £750K is annually available that could be used to target local issues, specifically the impact of tourist due to the dramatic influx in visitor numbers. A bid has been made. • Cllr Jarvis spoke on the upcoming LGR elections as Windermere and Ambleside will fall under the same Ward.
